Dr. Ives completed his renal fellowship at UCSF and was Chief of the Division of Nephrology at Parnassus from 1989 until 1998 when he stepped down after suffering a severe head injury from a cycling accident. Dr. Ives did research on the epithelial sodium channel, renal vesicular H⁺ ATPase and Ca²⁺ entry into vascular smooth muscle cells.
