## **Accomplishments and Awards**

- ❖ In 2012-2013, UCSF ranked #1 in terms of research funding from the NIH awarded to medical schools in the country. Within the school, the Department of Internal Medicine also ranked #1 (data is not further divided by sub-specialties). UCSF's School of Dentistry, School of Nursing and School of Pharmacy were also ranked #1 in NIH funding for their respective fields (<a href="http://www.brimr.org/NIH\_Awards/NIH\_Awards.htm">http://www.brimr.org/NIH\_Awards/NIH\_Awards.htm</a> ).
- In the first-ever large-scale survey of physicians on the quality of medical residency programs, participants were asked to name up to five programs they believe to offer the best clinical training in internal medicine.
